As a Peer Educator, you will:

- Deliver fun, interactive sessions in schools, youth groups and community spaces
- Run assemblies, workshops, and one-to-one conversations with other young people
- Help your peers understand registering to vote, voter ID rules, spotting misinformation, and why their vote truly matters
- Shape and co-design resources and activities that reflect your own community
- Become part of a national movement helping young people use their voice effectively
