


Meet our Ambassadors





Farah Khan



Michael Hill



Meet Justice4You


Justice4You are campaigning to end discrimination in their classrooms and curriculum.

Our recommendations to the Government

- 1) Commit to having a **racially diverse curriculum** from Key Stages 1-4.
- 2) Equip teachers with **tools to deal with racism in the classroom**, particularly how it intersects with other social factors.
- 3) **Address the underrepresentation of ethnic minority teachers.**


Kay Hayes
